The Maricopa County Board of Supervisors (BOS) has scheduled a public hearing on Wednesday February 1, 2017 (9:30 a.m.) to discuss/adopt revisions proposed by the Maricopa County Environmental Services Department (MCESD) to Maricopa County Environmental Health Code (MCEHC), Regulation 5 Fees:

Case #/Title: ES-2016-001/Mobile Food

Overview: Revisions to MCEHC Chapter I, Regulation 5 Fees:

Proposed updates do not increase current permit fees. However, title changes, e.g. Food Peddler to Mobile Food Type I, Pushcart to Mobile Food Type II and Mobile Food Unit to Mobile Food Type III changes are proposed. Additional proposed permit title updates include: Itinerant (Temporary) to Temporary Food Establishment, Seasonal Food Establishment to Seasonal Food Establishment/Annual Event Food Establishment, Food Service Manager to Certified Food Protection Manager, card to certificate or Limited Use Certificate, and Food Service Worker to Food Employee or Limited Use Food Employee.

Fee Schedule text changes for the above permit titles (including permit durations) are proposed. Plus, Fee Schedule deletions for Food Service Worker Card exam and class, each with a \$10.00 fee will be eliminated. In addition, the Food Peddler 6 month permit, proposed as the Mobile Food Type I - 6 month fee (\$60.00), is included in the Fee Schedule to agree with MCEHC Chapter VIII, Section III language that states the 6 month Food Peddler fee is half the cost of the 1 year permit.
